Dear Families.

Welcome to 2023 at St Anne's! The start to our year has been positive albeit a little bit different to years gone by. Our Pebbles ('baby' room) remains closed and our Pippies Room for 1-2 yr old children is only open Tuesdays and Thursdays (for now). As we bring on new Educators our plan is to extend the Pippies Room (to at least more than 8 children per day and hopefully more days!).

Well it's been a long time coming...Government has finally put into place some 'fee relief'...albeit for 4 year old children only, and some additional funding for Long Day Care Centres to "uplift and extend on the quality of Early Childhood Education". This has come under the NSW Government's Early Years Commitment. The Hon.Sarah Mitchell (NSW Minister for Education and Early Learning) says....

About 90% of a child's brain development happens in the first 5 years. It is in this transformational time in a child's life that, with the right support, they can be set on the path toward lifelong success.

Unfortunately too many children and families have not had the support they need in these earliest years, with 2 in 5 NSW children already behind in their developmental outcomes when they start school.

NSW Government is committing \$15.9 billion dollars over 10 years to give every child in NSW the very best start in life.

Please be assured, whilst the name of our service is St Anne's **Long Day Care Centre**, our service includes a very strong PRESCHOOL Program for the 3 to 5 year old children enrolled at St Anne's delivered by Early Childhood Teachers. The Preschool program focuses on developing early life skills (independence, confidence, resilience, emotional 'literacy', respect for others, kindness, being considerate)...as well as...developing the preacademic skills that will help them have a smooth transition into their next learning setting.

## PLEASE REMEMBER THE CARPARK RULES

## THAT YOU HAVE COMMITTED TO IN YOUR CHILD'S ENROLMENT FORM

St Anne's Long Day Care Centre considers the safety of all children and families to be of paramount importance. Families traveling to the Centre by car are asked to take extreme care, approach the Centre doing no more than 40 kms per hour (School Zone), and adhere to the following rules when dropping off and collecting children from the Centre.

### **Drivers must:**

- Keep a keen lookout for children
- Keep speed to no more than 10kms per hour within the carpark
  - Park only in designated parking spots (leaving the Disabled Car Space and Emergency Drop off area for those purposes only)
- Hold your child's hand at all times while walking in the carpark
- Do not leave children in your car without you
- Do not leave your car with the motor still running

It is important we all recognise that children depend on adults to keep them safe. Small children can be unpredictable in their movements, and do not have an understanding of road rules.

## THE HUMBLE NURSERY RHYME



Did you know "nursery rhymes" play an important role in your child's literacy development?

Nursery rhymes are important for young children because they help develop an ear for our language.

Both rhyme and rhythm help children hear the sounds and syllables in words, which helps children learn to read!

Nursery rhyme experiences, awareness, and knowledge have been found to be positively related to accomplishment in early phonological and printrelated skills. So, practise them in the car, on a walk or before bed.

Sing them high, sing them low, say them using funny voices. It's fun to rhyme, and so good for your little one's early literacy skills.

Dr Foster went to Gloucestor

## PREP 20 min | COOK 10 min | SERVES 8 INGREDIENTS

#### Chicken Meatballs:

1 kg chicken mince 1 cup fresh breadcrumbs, soaked in a 1/4 cup milk

2 eggs

1 cup parmesan cheese, grated

1 tbs garlic, minced

sea salt & pepper, to season

#### Basil Pistachio Pesto:

2 cups fresh basil leaves

1 cup baby spinach leaves

2 garlic cloves

1/2 cup pistachios

1/2 cup parmesan, grated zest and juice of 1 lemon

3/4 cup olive oil

500 grams **spaghetti,** cooked according to packet instructions reserving 1 cup of cooking water

#### METHOD:

**Place** the mince, breadcrumbs, eggs, parmesan, garlic, salt and pepper into a large bowl and mix thoroughly to combine. **Take** 2 heaped tablespoons of mince and roll into rounds. **Heat** a little olive oil in a fry pan over medium-high heat. **Add** meatballs and cook 6-8 minutes, stirring occasionally or until the meatballs are golden and cooked through. Set aside.

To make the Basil Pistachio Pesto: Place the basil, baby spinach, garlic, pistachios, parmesan, lemon juice and zest into the bowl of a food processor. Blitz for 1-2 minutes or until finely chopped. With the motor running, slowly add the olive oil and continue blitzing until thoroughly combined (scraping down the sides of the bowl as necessary).

**Pour** the pesto over the cooked spaghetti with a splash of the reserved pasta water and toss to combine. **Top** spaghetti with cooked meatballs, fresh basil leaves and a grating of parmesan cheese. Enjoy x
